Our School



Lahore Institute of Special care & Attention is one of FOUR inclusive setting school in Lahore. This prospectus gives a brief description of LISCA School, its organization and how it works to achieve its aims.

Key facts:

- LISCA is a day school for children and young people between the ages of 2 to 19 years
- Pupils present a range of complex needs which include
 - Severe Learning Difficulties (SLD)
 - Autistic Spectrum Conditions (ASC)
 - Profound and Multiple Learning Difficulties (PMLD)
 - Multi-Sensory Impairment (MSI)
 - Children with depression and anxiety
 - Behavioral problems as anger and lack of
 - confidence in children
 - Speech problems in children and adolescents
 - Difficulty in academics especially memorization,
 - exam tension, concentration issue
- LISCA became a Specialist Inclusive Setting School in September 2012. Before this LISCA ran only special classes morning and evening for Slow Learners since 2007. It is running its evening OPD sessions since 2002.

LISCA is a school which recognises the importance of working in partnership with pupils' families to optimise the abilities of each pupil. The staff team work with each family to ensure that every pupil individual skills and talents are monitored and developed on an on-going basis.

Pupil Behaviour

LISCA actively provides a friendly, calm and consistent atmosphere and curriculum which enables all staff and pupils to feel safe. The school has clear expectations of pupils and an agreed approach towards behaviour support.

The staff team focus is always on promoting positive pupil behaviour through consistency of staff attitude, regular and predictable routines, clear rules and boundaries and the systematic use of rewards and sanctions.

Facilities

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Pupils benefit from a range of resources including:

- Hydrotherapy
- Media suite
- Interactive light and sound room
- Music room
- Two soft-play areas
- Early years playground
- Adapted outdoor play and recreational facilities
- Post-16 horticulture provision, greenhouse & allotment





Curriculum

Pupils at LISCA receive specialist teaching and support therapies in all areas of their curriculum. The school uses the **Early Years Foundation Stage** and **Punjab Textboard curriculum** as the basis of priority learning areas for each pupil's **Individual Education Plan** (IEP).

Pupils and their families are supported through the requirements of the formal annual review process in partnership with the relevant staff team members and professionals.

Older students in the post-16 provision take relevant courses.

LISCA aims to identify and meet individual pupil needs through a personalised curriculum. The weekly timetable will reflect a range of ageappropriate and engaging lessons and activities within consistent boundaries and structured routines providing security and promoting independence.





A **Curriculum Forecast** is sent home at the beginning of each term explaining the term's theme and the main activities the pupil will experience during that period of time. This provides their family with an opportunity to follow up on work carried out at school and reinforce learning at home.



School Day



The school day commences at 9.05am and finishes at 12.30pm. All pupils have private transport.

Uniform

All pupils, excluding those within the post-16 provision, are expected to wear the school uniform. Full details can be obtained from the School Office.



School Meals

LISCA prefers home made food for pupils to avoid any medical problems.

Allergies

All precautions are taken to ensure that any pupil with an allergy does not come into contact with the relevant food group. A care plan and a risk assessment is undertaken specific to that pupil.



Staff Team

Our staff team is well established and highly experienced. Many of our current staff at all levels started their careers at LISCA. We continue to encourage and mentor new teachers from the ranks of our dedicated support staff team. This pro-active attitude to professional development truly embodies the school ethos of **Achieving Together**.





Our current staff to pupil ratio is above 1:2 so ensuring a high level of individual pupil interaction.

The school is led by a team which includes the Principal, Vice principal, one Assistant Headteacher, 2 Specialists in autistic spectrum conditions (ASC) and multi-sensory impairment (MSI), 1 Art and play therapist, 2 specialists in Learning Disabilities, 2 specialist with slow learners and 2 speech therapist.

Occupational Therapist visits on call.

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(LISCA) is a non-profit organization dedicated to empowering children and their parents to achieve their potential as loving, responsible families. The program provides comprehensive diagnostic and treatment services to children and families whose relationships and personal growth are impaired by emotional and behavioral problems. The LISCA Psychological Assessment Service provides specialized evaluations, or testing, of child and adolescent psychological functioning using standardized psychometric techniques. The clinic provides comprehensive evaluations within the areas of intellectual, academic, neuropsychological, adaptive, and social-emotional functioning.

Admissions

Scheduling an Appointment and Evaluation Procedures:

Parents, guardians, school officials, mental health providers, pediatricians and other service providers may refer children and adolescents to LISCA for testing. To request an appointment for an evaluation through LISCA, please call 03219441951 and ask for the testing coordinator. Testing takes place in evening from 4pm to 6pm and 3 visits are paid. Assessment include IQ test-verbal and nonverbal which includes learning disabilities test an personality test. Prior to scheduling an appointment, an intake packet is sent to the family, which includes two about the child/adolescent's developmental, medical, social and academ history. Once the forms are completed by the parent/guardian and returned to the clinic, the panel will review that information. We review the information, in addition to any additional reports of previous evaluations and school information in order to help us decide the most appropriate types of assessments that will be conducted.

Overview of Evaluation Procedures:

Parent completes intake packet Assignment to an evaluator for a comprehensive assessment Assessment visits are planned (approximately 3 - 10 hours). Evaluations take approximately 2 weeks to complete Individualized feedback session is conducted with the parent in order to review the results of the evaluation and the proposed recommendations Final written report is sent to the parent School psychologist attends school meetings, when requested

Fees and Payment Policy:

Parents typically pay for the psychological assessment services. There is an established hourly fee. Our policy is to be paid directly by the parent at the time of each session. The testing service administrator will answer questions regarding the current hourly rate. LISCA will accept payment from insurance companies, however, authorization is required for psychological testing. Authorization for psychological testing must be obtained prior to the start of testing. The Director of the LISCA will assist parents in applying for authorization from the state insurance companies. School Districts and other agencies may at times agre to pay for a comprehensive psychological evaluation.
